Status of the Kern Motorist Aid Authority's Call box Program (Napier)

Ms. Napier reported that in May of 2016 staff worked with Caltrans District 6 to develop a plan to remove call boxes in the metro Bakersfield area. Since that time, a number of call boxes along construction routes have also been removed and not replaced. KMMA call box network today has been reduced by 112 call boxes to 462 units, which is a 19.5% reduction in the network. In May of 2017 the Board requested that staff review call box usage and make recommendations for removing call boxes that generate few calls. Using usage reports from 2015/2016 staff focused on two specific routes. Interstate 5 from the Junction of SR 99 and I 5 south to the County line or the Grapevine area

and SR 178 from the Bakersfield City Limit, East to Lake Isabella. Staff has collaborated with CASE Systems to discuss the way to determine the best plan of action. CASE made the following recommendation, removing 40 percent of the system is feasible without affecting current motorist usage, specific removals will require more detailed analyzes and 40 percent reduction would yield \$7,400 per month savings. Mr. Hakimi stated that removing 40 percent of the system may be challenging to get approved by Caltrans and CHP. Mr. Hakimi stated that for the past three years they have spent about \$3,000 or \$4,000 more than is taken in. Reserves have been used to pay for KERN 511, the call box system and the litter pick-up. He went on to state that the recommendation from CASE was not enough to get us past our deficit. Mr. Hakimi stated that his recommendation would be that the Board motion to completely remove the system.

Mr. Hakimi and Ms. Napier answered questions from the Board.

Luis Gill, Executive Director of the Bakersfield Homeless Shelter addressed the Board and expressed the importance of the litter removal program and how it has positively affected the community.

Director Scrivner made a motion to completely remove the system. Director Gurrola seconded the motions. Motion carried with a roll call vote.

At the discretion of the Kern COG Board, Community At-Large Members may reapply and be appointed for two (2) additional (2) year terms, not to exceed six (6) consecutive years.

Schedule:

- October 2017 – Advertise and take applications for two Community At-Large Members;
- November 1, 2017 – Applications due to Kern COG Executive Director;
- November 2018 – Review applications and provide information to the Kern COG Board;
- November 2018 – Kern COG Board make appointments to be effective for the February 2018 RPAC meeting.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Committee Purpose

The purpose of the Regional Planning Advisory Committee (RPAC) is to review and make recommendations on key activities associated with regional transportation plans and other planning issues, including SB 375 implementation. The goal of the Kern COG RPAC is to seek all points of view from Kern COG members and agency partners working to reach consensus on issues.

Committee Membership and Voting

Members of the RPAC are Planning Directors, Community Development Directors or their designees from each of Kern Council of Governments' member jurisdictions. If the member agency does not have the equivalent of a Planning Director, the manager/administrator from that jurisdiction/agency shall designate a representative and alternate from the management level.

In addition to member jurisdiction representatives, the RPAC shall have additional voting representatives from Golden Empire Transit District and Caltrans District 6.

Community At-Large Voting Members

Three at large members shall represent varied economic, social and geographic sectors. At large members could include appointed representatives from business groups, non-profit organizations, the military and tribes. The at-large members shall be appointed by the Kern COG Board of Directors.

Ex-Officio Non-Voting Member

One permanent ex-officio non-voting member shall consist of the Executive Officer of the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO).

Recruitment Process for Community At-Large Voting Members

- As vacancies occur, postings of Community At-Large Member will be noticed for 30 days.
- Potential members must submit an application to the Secretary of the Kern COG Board of Directors (Executive Director).

- The Executive Director shall review all RPAC candidate applications, verify the information and evaluate eligibility. Candidate applications for membership to the RPAC will be forwarded to the Kern COG Board of Directors.
- The Kern COG Board of Directors will review the candidate applications and appoint members to the RPAC.

Community At-Large Member Term of Appointment

- The term of appointment of the Community At-Large Members shall be two (2) years.
- At the discretion of the Kern COG Board, Community At-Large Members may reapply and be appointed for two (2) additional (2) year terms, not to exceed six (6) consecutive years.

Eligibility

- U.S. citizen 18 years of age or older who resides within Kern County.
- Not an elected official at any level of government.
- Not an appointed official at any level of government i.e. city or county Planning Commission, Local Agency Formation Commission, etc.
- Not a public employee, private contractor, consultant or employee of a consultant doing business with the Kern County, nor of any of the incorporated cities in Kern County, Golden Empire Transit, Caltrans, or the Kern Council of Governments.
- Restricted to individuals without economic interest in Kern COG projects.

DESCRIPTION:

The City of Bakersfield has requested \$50,000 in financial assistance to develop a Bakersfield Parking Study. This agreement has been sent to County Counsel for review.

DISCUSSION:

As part of its 2017-18 Overall Work Program, Kern Council of Governments approved financial assistance for a parking pricing study to provide an economic analysis of potential sites and managed parking pricing. The City of Bakersfield has agreed to initiate the work necessary to identify issues to be addressed in the development of the parking study. Funding was approved in work element 606.3.

Kern COG staff has prepared a Memorandum of Agreement implementing the program and recommends approval.

To expedite the project the City of Bakersfield approved the attached agreement at its August 16, 2017 meeting.

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
KERN COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS AND
THE CITY OF BAKERSFIELD**

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 21st day of September 2017, is by and between the City of Bakersfield (hereinafter "CITY ") and Kern Council of Governments, a joint powers entity (hereinafter "KERN COG"),

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, KERN COG adopted the FY 2017-18 Overall Work Program and Financial Plan; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the funds programmed for expenditure within Work Element 606.3 includes funding to provide an economic analysis of potential sites and managed parking pricing; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has requested financial assistance for the development of the Bakersfield Parking Study; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has agreed to initiate the work necessary to identify issues to be addressed in the development of the aforementioned Parking Study; and

WHEREAS, KERN COG is willing to provide the funding necessary from funds programmed for such programs during FY 2017-18.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. CITY shall be the lead agency for the development of the Bakersfield Parking Study (hereinafter the "Study").
2. KERN COG shall reimburse CITY from funds programmed for technical assistance in an amount not to exceed FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000.00) for costs incurred by CITY in developing the Study.
3. CITY shall complete all work on this Study no later than June 30, 2018, unless an extension of time is granted in writing by KERN COG.
4. CITY shall allow KERN COG staff to review a copy of the Request for Proposal, if any, for consulting services prior to its distribution. In addition, CITY shall allow KERN COG staff to review a copy of the contract for the development of the Study with the CITY'S consultant prior to execution of said contract by the CITY and its consultant.
5. CITY shall submit one (1) invoice to KERN COG upon completion and acceptance of the Study by KERN COG. Requisition for payment shall refer to Work Element No. 606.3 or as may be specified in a written notice by KERN COG. Specific budget category detail is given below:
 - A. Direct Labor and Fringe Benefits: All direct labor charges should be billed by class of employee, rate per hour and number of hours. (Anticipated personnel cost-of-living or merit increase, if any, should be reflected in the budget.
 - B. Other Direct Costs: All direct costs billed must be specifically identified. Any travel costs may not exceed the per diem (\$65.00/day meals; \$225.00/day accommodations) and mileage rates (\$.535/mile) payable to KERN COG employees. Any other direct costs not specifically identified in the contract budget cannot be reimbursed.

6. Either party may, at its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days written notice to that effect to the other party. In such event, CITY shall be paid for any work satisfactorily completed prior to the effective termination date.
7. CITY shall indemnify, defend (upon written request of KERN COG) and save harmless KERN COG, its officers, agents and employees from any and all losses, damages, liability, claims or causes of action of every nature whatsoever for physical damage to or destruction of property, including the property of KERN COG, or physical injury to or death of any person or persons, including KERN COG's officers, agents and employees, which may arise out of any act or omission of the CITY, its officers, agents, independent contractors or employees during the performance of this Agreement.
8. No waiver of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any other breach, or of such provision. Failure of either party to enforce at any time, or from time-to-time, any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver thereof. The remedies herein reserved shall be cumulative and in addition to any other remedies in law or equity.
9. Should any part, term, portion, or provision of this Agreement be finally decided to be in conflict with any law of the United States or the State of California, or otherwise be unenforceable or ineffectual, the validity of the remaining parts, terms, portions, or provisions shall be deemed severable and shall not be affected thereby, provided such remaining portions or provisions can be construed in substance to constitute the agreement which the parties intended to enter into in the first instance.
10. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this Agreement shall be of no force or effect excepting a subsequent modification in writing, signed by the party to be charged.
11. The terms of this Agreement shall be construed and interpreted under, and all respective rights and duties shall be governed by, the laws of the State of California.
12. Any notice or notices required or permitted to be given pursuant to this Agreement may be personally served on the other party by the party giving such notice or may be served by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following addresses:

13. The individual executing this Agreement on behalf of each party warrants that he/she is authorized to execute the Agreement on behalf of their agency and that the agency will be bound by the terms and conditions contained herein.
14. CITY acknowledges that CITY, and all subcontractors hired by CITY to perform services under this Agreement, are aware of and understand the Immigration Reform and Control Act ("IRCA"). CITY is and shall remain in compliance with the IRCA and shall ensure that any subcontractors hired by CITY to perform services under this Agreement are in compliance with the IRCA. In addition, CITY agrees to indemnify, defend and hold

harmless KERN COG, its agents, officers and employees, from any liability, damages or causes of action arising out of or relating to any claims that CITY's employees, or the employees of any subcontractor hired by CITY, are not authorized to work in the United States for CITY or its subcontractor and/or any other claims based upon alleged IRCA violations committed by CITY or CITY's subcontractor(s).

15. CITY agrees to maintain and make available to KERN COG accurate books and records relative to all its activities under this Agreement. CITY shall permit KERN COG to audit, examine and make excerpts and transcripts from such records, and to conduct audits of all invoices, materials, records of personnel or other data related to all other matters covered by this Agreement. CITY shall maintain such data and records in an accessible location and condition for a period of not less than three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement, or until after the conclusion of any audit, whichever occurs last. The State of California and/or any federal agency having an interest in the subject of this Agreement shall have the same rights conferred upon KERN COG herein.
16. CITY shall observe and comply with all applicable state, federal, and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations now in effect or hereafter enacted, each of which are hereby made a part hereof and incorporated herein by reference.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT to be executed by their respective officers and agents thereunto duly authorized as of the day and year first above written.

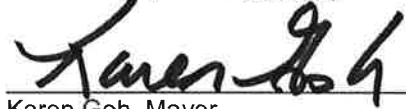

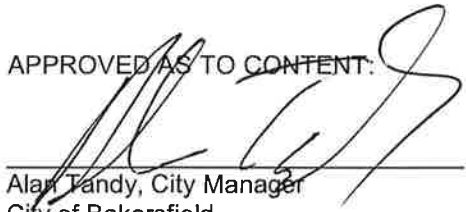

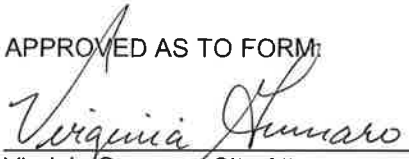
