UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS

DESCRIPTION:

On September 16, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom signed into law Assembly Bill (AB) 361 which authorizes a local agency to use teleconferencing without complying with the teleconferencing requirements imposed by the Ralph M. Brown Act when a legislative body holds a meeting during a declared state of emergency or when state or local health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.

DISCUSSION:

Until January 1, 2024, AB 361 authorizes a local agency to use teleconferencing without complying with the teleconferencing requirements imposed by the Ralph M. Brown Act when a legislative body holds a meeting during a declared state of emergency or when state or local health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, and during a proclaimed state of emergency when the legislative body has determined that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

The bill requires the legislative body to take no further action on agenda items when there is a disruption which prevents the public agency from broadcasting the meeting, or in the event of a disruption within the local agency's control which prevents members of the public from offering public comments, until public access is restored.

AB 361 prohibit the legislative body from requiring public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and specifies that the legislative body must provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comment in real time. When there is a continuing state of emergency, or when state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, the bill would require a legislative body to make specified findings not later than 30 days after the first

teleconferenced meeting, and to make those findings every 30 days thereafter, in order to continue to meet under the abbreviated teleconferencing procedures.

Based on the information above, Kern COG developed Resolution No. 23-02 for Board review and approval.

In the matter of:

- A RESOLUTION OF KERN COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE KERN COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND ALL OF ITS COMMITTEES FOR THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 19, 2023, TO FEBRUARY 18, 2023, PURSUANT TO THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT.
- **WHEREAS**, all meetings of the Kern Council Governments Board of Directors and all of its Committees are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code §§ 54950 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and view the legislative bodies conduct their business; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions and requirements; and
- **WHEREAS**, a required condition of Government Code section 54953(e) is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558(b); and
- **WHEREAS**, a further required condition of Government Code section 54953(e) is that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body holds a meeting to determine or has determined by a majority vote that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and
- **WHEREAS**, on March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a Proclamation of a State of Emergency declaring a state of emergency exists in California due to the threat of COVID-19, pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code section 8625); and
- **WHEREAS**, on June 11, 2021, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-07-21, which formally rescinded the Stay-at-Home Order (Executive Order N-33-20), as well as the framework for a gradual, risk-based reopening of the economy (Executive Order N-60-20, issued on May 4, 2020) but did not rescind the proclaimed state of emergency; and
- **WHEREAS**, on June 11, 2021, Governor Newsom also issued Executive Order N-08-21, which set expiration dates for certain paragraphs of the State of Emergency Proclamation dated March 4, 2020, and other Executive Orders but did not rescind the proclaimed state of emergency; and
- **WHEREAS**, as of the date of this Resolution, neither the Governor nor the state Legislature have exercised their respective powers pursuant to Government Code section 8629 to lift the state of emergency either by proclamation or by concurrent resolution the state Legislature; and
- **WHEREAS**, the California Department of Industrial Relations has issued regulations related to COVID-19 Prevention for employees and places of employment. Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 3205(5)(D) specifically recommends physical (social) distancing as one of the measures to decrease the spread of COVID-19 based on the fact that particles containing the virus can travel more than six feet, especially indoors; and

WHEREAS, the Kern Council of Governments finds that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, based on the California Department of Industrial Relations' issuance of regulations related to COVID-19 Prevention through Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 3205(5)(D); and

WHEREAS, as a consequence, the Kern Council of Governments does hereby find that it and its legislative bodies shall conduct their meetings by teleconferencing without compliance with Government Code section 54953 (b)(3), pursuant to Section 54953(e), and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed by Government Code section 54953(e)(2).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND AND ORDERED by the Kern Council of Governments Board of Directors, County of Kern, State of California, in regular session assembled on January 19, 2023, does hereby resolve as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. <u>Recitals</u>. All of the above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.
- Section 2. State or Local Officials Have Imposed or Recommended Measures to Promote Social Distancing. The Kern Council of Governments hereby proclaims that state officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social (physical) distancing based on the California Department of Industrial Relations' issuance of regulations related to COVID-19 Prevention through Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 3205(5)(D).
- Section 3. Remote Teleconference Meetings. The Kern Council of Governments and any of its legislative bodies are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.
- Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of (i) January 19, 2023, or (ii) such time the Kern Council of Governments adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which its legislative bodies may continue to teleconference without compliance with Section 54953(b)(3).

Opening four Lanes from Lost Hills Road to East End of the Project in mid to late November. Sump Fence work planned to be completed by mid-November.

KERN COG SENATE BILL NO. 1 TRANSIT - CALTRANS STATE OF GOOD REPAIR

AMENDED REGIONAL PROGRAM OF PROJECTS

DESCRIPTION:

Caltrans State of Good Repair (SGR) Program allocates annual funds from Senate Bill No.1 legislation to the Kern region in combination with a supplemental allocation of the State Transit Assistance (STA) fund. Golden Empire Transit (GET) District has agreed to transfer it's "50 percent" apportionment for FY 2022-23 to City of Tehachapi. In turn, City of Tehachapi agrees to transfer its allocation for FY 2026-27 to GET.

DISCUSSION:

Kern COG staff apportioned FY 2022-23 funds initiated by Caltrans State of Good Repair (SGR) Program to GET totaling \$140,154.60. Since the Kern COG SGR regional apportionment adoption, GET has requested its FY 2022-23 "50 percent" apportionment (based on the apportionment schedule below-\$140,154.60) be transferred to the City of Tehachapi to assist in an SGR eligible project.

Kern COG staff has prepared a regional **SGR** apportionment schedule (See below) for the Kern region to ensure this year's **SGR** projects are funded. **Amendment No. 1**

DESCRIPTION:

The Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) is required to be updated every 4-years and contains a long range 24-year transportation expenditure portfolio fulfilling numerous policies and regulations including but not limited to public involvement, social equity, air quality conformity, congestion management, and Senate Bill (SB) 375 per capita greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction targets.

DISCUSSION:

This discussion provides update on the activity related to the RTP and the SB 375 Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS).

December 16, 2022 – The 2022 RTP/Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) short range program air quality conformity was federally approved. The 2023 FTIP "CTIPS Report" and "Grouped Project Listing" weblinks are available at: https://www.kerncog.org/2023-ftip/.

November 29, 2022 – Kern COG submitted the technical methodology data package to the California Air Resources Board (ARB). ARB is required to provide their finding and recommendations 2 months after the submittal is found to be complete.

July 21, 2022 - the Kern COG Board adopted the 2022 RTP/SCS and associated documents. The documents are available online at https://www.kerncog.org/category/docs/rtp/.

FEDERAL PERFORMANCE MEASURE (PM3) TARGETS FOR TRAVEL

TIME, DELAY, AND VEHICLE OCCUPANCY

DESCRIPTION:

Federal travel time reliability, peak hour excessive delay, and non-single occupancy Vehicles (SOV) performance measures (PM3), for jurisdictions with National Highway System (NHS) mileage (Kern, Bakersfield, Shafter, Cal City and Caltrans), have been developed consistent with the state targets and the federal methodology.

DISCUSSION:

Under the requirements of the federal transportation spending bill, MAP-21, states and metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) like Kern COG are required to annually monitor performance measure progress through the statewide and metropolitan planning process. Failure to meet targets will require Caltrans to explain why to FHWA. In addition, FHWA will review how MPOs are addressing and achieving their targets (or assisting the state in achieving targets) as they conduct the 4-Year agency certification reviews. Maintaining Federal MPO certification is a pre-requisite to receiving federal funding. Kern's next four-year review is in 2023. At that review Kern COG intends to report the existing performance measure methods in the RTP and the Project Delivery Policy and Procedures. Caltrans gave the MPOs until November 29, 2022, to set the following targets: Travel Time Reliability, Peak Hour Excessive Delay, and Non Single Occupancy Vehicles (Non SOV). Note that PM3 is in addition to PM1 – Safety Target and PM2 – Bride and Pavement Condition Targets.

Travel Time Reliability - Caltrans has established statewide targets using the National Performance Management Research Data Set (NPMRDS) with travel time data from INRIX propriety cell phone data for Kern's NHS routes. An informative link on the federal

Travel time reliability for a segment = (80%tile travel time)/(50%tile travel time). Caltrans considers Travel time reliability<1.5 as reliable. Below are travel time reliability maps using that method.

Caltrans had an October 19, 2022, travel time target setting meeting. The Travel time reliability is 83.7% statewide. During the meeting, the vote was for the baseline 2-year target to be 84.2% and 4 year target to be 84.7%, a 1% increase. Kern COG staff agreed to those targets. For the Kern County Area for 2021, the travel time reliability is 95.1%. Steven Vo from Caltrans discussed with Kern COG staff that even though Kern already exceeded the statewide target, he recommended a 95.2% as a 2 year and 4-year target for Kern since it is Kern a positive increase. Even though it is a slight increase, it is still positive since Kern already has a high travel time reliability compared to the rest of the state. Kern COG staff agreed to those targets. Caltrans will contact Kern COG in 2 years to give the opportunity to adjust the 4-year target depending on that time how well perform with the 2 year target.

Figure 1 – 2021 Travel Time Reliability on NHS Countywide






Figure 2 – 2021 Travel Time Reliability on NHS in Metropolitan Bakersfield



Peak Hour Excessive Delay - On November 9, 2022, Kern COG staff had an individual meeting with Caltrans to establish Bakersfield Urbanized Area targets for Peak Hour Excessive Delay. Using the NPMRDS the Annual Hours of Peak Hour Excessive Delay Per Capita are 9.6 for the Bakersfield Urbanized Area for 2021. During the meeting, Kern COG staff recommends the use of the State's established baseline targets for the Bakersfield Urbanized Area baseline 2-year target of 9.55 and baseline 4 year target of 9.5.

Non-Single Occupancy Vehicles - As part of the November 9, 2022 meeting with Caltrans, Kern COG staff also established U.S. Census Bakersfield Urbanized Area targets for Non Single Occupancy Vehicles (Non SOV). According to the U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2021, the Bakersfield Urbanized Area has 20.2% Non SOV (including transit, walk, bike, taxi, or worked from home, with a margin of error of 1.4%). Kern COG staff agrees to the Caltrans proposed baseline 2-Year target of 20.4% and 4-Year target of 20.6%. Both increases the Non SOV by 1% for each of 2-years. Caltrans will also contact Kern COG in 2-years to give the opportunity to adjust the 4-year target depending on that time how well perform with the 2-year target.

Member agencies are encouraged to promote projects and policies that will help the region's NHS routes to perform as good or better than targets for our region.

Cycle 6 Active Transportation Program – Statewide Call for Projects

<u>DESCRIPTION:</u> The California Transportation Commission (CTC) closed the statewide Cycle 6 Active Transportation Program (ATP) Call for Projects on June 16, 2022. Kern COG agencies submitted a total of 19 applications.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> At their March 16-17, 2022, meeting, the CTC adopted the 2022 ATP Cycle 6 Fund Estimate and program Guidelines. With the adoption of the Guidelines, the Cycle 6 Active Transportation Program call for projects was subsequently initiated. The CTC adopted their selected statewide applications at the December 7-8, 2022, meeting. One Kern region project was included in the statewide project adoption, which is the County of Kern Norris Pedestrian and Railroad Safety project totaling \$9.8 million. All remaining Kern COG applications are now under consideration for funding with the MPO share of the Cycle 6 ATP funding.

At the recent January 4, 2023, Transportation Technical Advisory Committee, the County of Kern announced that they were withdrawing the Mt. Vernon project from the MPO list because another grant was awarded for the same project. So now, the draft MPO list is modified to show a partial ATP funding for the Bakersfield H St. Corridor project resulting from this change. The draft MPO list, found on Page 3, would use all available MPO share of ATP Cycle 6 funding made available to Kern COG and reflects the adopted regional ATP policy. The updated timeline below provides a reminder of what's next for this ATP Cycle 6 call for projects.

Recent CTC Activity – On December 7, 2022, the CTC adopted its final statewide project list for ATP Cycle 6. The final project list is posted at:

Background: At the August 18, 2022, California Transportation Commission (CTC) meeting, the Commission adopted a revised Fund Estimate for the Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 6, which is now adopted. The approved revised Fund Estimate for the statewide ATP budget is now **\$1.7 billion** due to an infusion of funding from the recently approved 2022-23 state budget. The Kern COG guaranteed regional share of that statewide has been increased to **\$16.798 million**. During the August CTC meeting, presenters noted several things:

- 1) the total number of applications for Cycle 6 was over \$3 billion.
- 2) the CTC hopes that a good ATP delivery record will encourage future legislated ATP add-on funds;
- 3) the full amount is available in the first year, but projects will be programmed over a 4-year period; and
- 4) the CTC will support early allocation requests for delivery of the Cycle 6 projects.

Original Fund Estimate –The statewide budget for the 2022 ATP Cycle 6 Call for Projects for the 4-year span for this cycle, 2023-24 through 2026-27, is \$1.7 billion. Now that the staff recommendation has been published, Kern COG will consider funding those applications in the order that they were ranked by the state. The original Kern COG's MPO target funding amount for Cycle 6 for the 4-year span from 2023-24 through 2026-28, is \$16.8 million. Kern COG staff will develop an MPO list in January 2023 and circulate it to the TTAC. In February, staff will provide a TTAC item with the recommended final MPO list for regional adoption on February 16, 2023. The adopted MPO list will be sent to the CTC by February 20, for adoption of MPO selected projects by June 2023.

Kern COG Policy Background - CTC ATP Guidelines and Fund Estimate establish the project selection process and ATP programming capacity for the state and MPO share. When ATP first began, the Kern Council of Governments adopted its ATP project delivery policy that defers to the original state application review and ranking for all original state submitted applications. Kern COG does not do a separate ATP Call for Projects to use the MPO share and therefore does not adopt its own modified guidelines or conduct a separate MPO call for projects. Instead, Kern COG considers the remaining applications for MPO share funding following the ranking order as best as possible already established by the state-ranked applications not selected by the state. Submitted applications from Kern agencies - The ATP Cycle 6 statewide call for projects resulted in 19 Kern region submitted applications for a value of **\$69 million**. They are listed on page 3. This table has been updated to include the ranking values for each application. The County of Kern project that ranked 91 is highlighted in yellow. This project has been approved for state funding. Projects recommended for the MPO list are highlighted in blue. This selection is based on Kern COG policy and has been financially constrained to the CTC adopted

ATP Cycle 6 Fund Estimate. Kern COG's revised share is estimated at \$16,798,000 over a 4-year programming cycle from 2023-24 through 2026-27. This item is for information and will be an action item in February.

TRANSIT PROGRAM

The City of Delano, Golden Empire Transit District, and Kern County request to add new transit projects (operating assistance, preventive maintenance, property, vehicles) funded with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307 and FTA Section 5339 funding. Please see records KER230801 through KER230807 in Attachment for details.

The Golden Empire Transit District requests to revise two existing bus purchase projects. Please see records KER200807 and KER200812 in Attachment for details.

NON-MOTORIZED PROGRAM

Kern COG is proposing a formal amendment (Type #3) to its regionally approved 2023 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). The 2023 FTIP is the programming document that identifies four years (FY 22/23, FY 23/24, FY 24/25, and FY 25/26) of federal, state and local funding sources for projects in Kern County. Draft Amendment No. 2 revises the State Highway/Regional Choice Program, Transit Program, and Non-Motorized Program. Documentation associated with this amendment is provided as indicated below.

- Project List: Attachment 1 includes a summary of programming changes that result from Amendment No. 2 to the 2023 FTIP. These projects and/or project phases are consistent with the 2022 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), which was adopted July 21, 2022. The attachment also includes the CTIPS printout for the proposed project changes.
- Updated Financial Plan: Attachment 2 The Financial Plan from the 2023 FTIP has been updated to include the project list as provided in Attachment 1. The appropriate grouped project list has been updated as well.
- Conformity Requirements: The proposed project changes have been determined to be exempt from the requirement that a conformity determination and/or regional emissions analysis be performed per 40 CFR 93.126, 93.127, or 93.128. Because the projects and/or project phases are exempt, no further conformity determination is required. In addition, the projects and/or project phases contained in Amendment No. 2 do not interfere with the timely implementation of any approved Transportation Control Measures (TCMs).
- FTIP Amendment Policy: Attachment 3 includes narrative that is added to the FTIP document describing FTIP amendment criteria/procedures as requested by the Federal Highway Administration. The FTIP is subject to continual review and modifications to assure timely delivery of programs and projects. For reference, the complete Kern COG FTIP Amendment Policy is also included (as adopted February 20, 2020 and posted on the Kern COG website at: www.kerncog.org/category/docs/ftip/)
- Public Involvement: Attachment 4 includes the Draft Public Notice.

Kern COG published a notice of public hearing and opened the 14-day public comment period January 6, 2023. The public hearing is scheduled for 6:30 PM January 19, 2023. Comments may be submitted in writing no later than January 20, 2023. No Kern COG Board action is required.

The Kern COG Executive Director will consider adoption of the proposed amendment January 23, 2023. Kern COG anticipates State and Federal approval by March 2023. Amendment No. 2 documentation is available at: www.kerncog.org/category/docs/ftip/

FTIP Amendment Policy adopted 2/20/20

FTIP Amendment Policy

The FTIP will need to be amended periodically following its adoption to reflect changes in the program including project additions, deletions and revisions. The Kern Council of Governments (Kern COG) Federal Transportation Improvement Program Amendment Policy (adopted February 20, 2020) is posted at: https://www.kerncog.org/category/docs/ftip/. Administrative Modifications or Amendments to the FTIP shall be submitted to Kern COG in writing (on agency letterhead). The request shall show all recommended changes including a description of the revision. Kern COG staff shall determine if an Administrative Modification or Amendment is necessary for the requested revision.

Projects programmed may be delivered in any of the recognized program years of the FSTIP provided Expedited Project Selection Procedures have been adopted. Such revisions do not require an administrative modification or an amendment if the change does not require an air quality conformity determination.

1. DEFINITIONS:

A. Administrative Modifications are minor changes to the FSTIP/FTIP that do not require a conformity determination, a demonstration of fiscal constraint, public review and comment, or federal approval. In general, administrative modifications are minor project changes, including changes to funding sources, description, lead agency, scheduling. Specific administrative modification criteria are available as part of the adopted Kern COG Federal Transportation Improvement Program Amendment Policy.

- B. Amendments are all other modifications to FSTIP/FTIP that are not Administrative Modifications. Examples include:
 - 1. Introduction of a new project;
 - 2. Scope changes that affect the approved air quality conformity analysis;
 - 3. Funding changes that exceed 50% of individually listed projects or impact the financial constraint of the funding program.

2. PROCEDURES:

A. Administrative Modifications

Kern COG's Executive Director has delegated authority to approve Administrative Modifications to the FSTIP/FTIP. No State or Federal action is required.

B. Amendments

Amendments to the FSTIP must be developed in accordance with the provisions of 23 CFR 450 and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and/or Federal Transit Administration (FTA). Each Kern COG approved FTIP amendment will be forwarded to Caltrans Headquarters, Division of Transportation Programming for approval on behalf of the Governor. Kern COG will also forward a copy of the amendment to FHWA and FTA at the same time the amendment is sent to Caltrans.

INTRODUCTION

Administrative Modifications or Amendments to the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) shall be submitted to Kern Council of Governments (Kern COG) in writing (on agency letterhead). The request shall show all recommended changes including a description of the revision. Kern COG staff shall determine if an Administrative Modification or Amendment is necessary for the requested revision. That determination shall be made in writing by Kern COG staff prior to presenting the requested revision to the Kern COG governing Board.

The following procedures are applicable for processing amendments and administrative modifications to the Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) and FTIP.

Projects programmed in the FSTIP may be delivered in any of the recognized program years of the FSTIP provided Expedited Project Selection Procedures have been adopted in accordance with 23 CFR 450 and the required interagency consultation or coordination is completed and documented. Such revisions do not require an administrative modification or an amendment if the change does not require an air quality conformity determination.

1) DEFINITIONS:

<u>A) Administrative Modifications</u> are minor changes to the FSTIP/FTIP that do not require a conformity determination, a demonstration of fiscal constraint, public review and comment, or federal approval:

- 1. Revise description of individually listed projects without changing the project scope or conflicting with the approved environmental document;
- 2. Revise the description of grouped project listings, as defined in 23 CFR Part 450.326(h), if it is consistent with the Programming Grouped Project Listings in Air Quality Non-Attainment or Maintenance Areas guidance;
- 3. Revise the funding amount listed for a project or a project phase:
 - a. Additional funding to an individually listed project is limited to the lesser of 50 percent of the total project cost or \$20 million;
 - b. No limit on adding funds to a grouped project listing. Funding capacity must be available in the FSTIP/FTIP prior to processing programming changes and it must be stated in the supporting documentation. (Note: Updated FTIP financial plans may be requested by Caltrans to validate fiscal constraint if an MPO has processed only administrative modifications for a period of six months or more.)
- 4. Program preliminary engineering (PE) phase, provided the right-of-way and/or construction phase(s) are already programmed in the current FSTIP/FTIP and additional funding amounts stay within the limits specified in Section 3 above;
- 5. Change the source of funds;
- 6. Change a project lead agency;
- 7. Program federal funds for Advance Construction conversion provided that programming capacity is available in the FSTIP/FTIP prior to programming the conversion;
- 8. Change program year of funds within the current FSTIP/FTIP, provided Expedited Project Selection Procedures are in place;
- 9. Split or combine individually listed projects provided schedule and scope remain unchanged;
- 10. Add or delete projects from grouped project listings;
- 11. Program emergency repair projects on state and local highways caused by natural disaster or catastrophic failure from external cause that are not covered by the Emergency Relief Program and exempt from air quality conformity requirements;
- 12. Re-program a project for which FHWA funds were transferred to FTA in the prior FSTIP/FTIP cycle but has not received grant approval from the FTA. The project can be programmed in the current FSTIP/FTIP via administrative modification provided original scope or cost remain unchanged. Use the type "FTA 5307 (FHWA Transfer Funds)" to program in the FSTIP/FTIP.

- 13. Program FTA projects from the prior FSTIP/FTIP into the current FSTIP/FTIP provided original scope or cost remain unchanged. Prior year funding must be differentiated from the current year funding by including narrative in the project description (or in "CTIPS MPO Comments" section) stating the year, amount and type of the prior year funds.
- 14. Make minor changes to the FTA funded grouped project listings. Minor changes include changing the number of transit vehicles purchased by 20% or less and changes to the fuel type of transit vehicles. Kern COG must conduct an interagency consultation to confirm that the change in scope is deemed minor.

B) Amendments are all other modifications to FSTIP/FTIP that are not Administrative Modifications. Examples include:

- 1. Introduction of a new project;
- 2. Scope changes that affect the approved air quality conformity analysis;
- 3. Funding changes that exceed 50% of individually listed projects or impact the financial constraint of the funding program.

2) PROCEDURES:

A) Administrative Modifications

Kern COG's Executive Director has delegated authority to approve Administrative Modifications to the FSTIP/FTIP. Once approved by the Kern COG Executive Director, the Administrative Modification will be deemed part of the California FSTIP. No State or Federal action will be required. Each Kern COG approved administrative modification will be forwarded to Caltrans Headquarters, Division of Transportation Programming, FHWA, and FTA. If needed, Kern COG will demonstrate in a subsequent amendment that the net financial change from each modification has been accounted.

B) Amendments

Amendments to the FSTIP must be developed in accordance with the provisions of 23 CFR 450 and approved by the FHWA and/or FTA in accordance with 23 CFR 450. Kern COG's Executive Director has been delegated to approve Amendment Types* 2 and 3 at the Executive Director's discretion. Each Kern COG approved TIP amendment will be forwarded to Caltrans Headquarters, Division of Transportation Programming for approval on behalf of the Governor. To expedite processing, Kern COG will also forward a copy of the amendment to FHWA and FTA at the same time the amendment is sent to Caltrans. Once approved by Caltrans, on behalf of the Governor, Caltrans will forward the amendment to FHWA and/or FTA for Federal approval. Once approved by FHWA and/or FTA the amendment will be incorporated into California's FSTIP. The FHWA and/or FTA approval will be addressed to Caltrans, with copies to Kern COG.

3) DISPUTE RESOLUTION

If a question arises on the interpretation of the definition of an administrative modification, Caltrans, Kern COG, FHWA and FTA (the parties) will consult with each other to resolve the question. If after consultation, the parties disagree on the definition of what constitutes an administrative modification, the final decision rests with the FTA for transit projects and FHWA for highway projects.
