<u>Comment:</u> The Regional Early Action Planning Grants of 2021 (REAP) 2.0 are a key part of strategic investments toward a more sustainable, resilient, and inclusive future for people in all areas of the state. Building off of the application submitted by the Kern Council of Governments in December 2022, as approved at the November 17, 2022, Board Meeting, this Resolution conditionally commits \$6 million in Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) 2.0 funds to the City of Bakersfield to support Bakersfield's efforts to secure additional funding for its REAP funded projects. This action furthers Bakersfield's ability to meet the goals of the REAP program and fulfill the activities associated with Kern COG's application.

DESCRIPTION:

EV Ready Communities agreement between Kern COG and DKS Associates to provide funding to develop the 2024 Kern Electric Vehicle Charging Station (EVCS) Blueprint. County Counsel has been provided the agreement for review.

DISCUSSION:

During the California Energy Commission (CEC) Business Meeting held on January 26, 2022, the commissioners approved augmenting the initial agreement with Kern COG by (1) increasing the award to the requested \$2.5 million (an increase of \$1,792,485), (2) increasing the matching fund requirement to \$833,377, (3) extending the term of the agreement to December 31, 2024, (4) revising the Scope of Work, and (5) revising the Schedule of Products. The Scope of Work comprises the installation of charging stations throughout Kern County, workforce development, developing electric ridesharing services in Bakersfield and Ridgecrest, conducting outreach to increase EV awareness, data collection and analysis, hire a consultant to complete program management, reporting, and outreach tasks and updating the 2019 Kern EVCS Blueprint by producing a 2024 Kern EVCS Blueprint.

In producing the 2024 EVCS Blueprint, DKS will address the following key technical objectives.

- Updating and mapping existing EV charging station locations
- Projecting charger needs for 2030, 2035, and 2050
- Updating goals and strategies to align with regional planning and programming
- Updating goals and tracking processes
- Increasing the region's competitiveness for state and/or federal funding opportunities.

Under the agreement, DKS will receive \$200,000 to evaluate the 2019 Kern EVCS Blueprint implementation and to produce the 2024 Kern EVCS Blueprint. The start date for the agreement is August 17, 2023, and the termination date is October 31, 2024.

Staff requests approval of the agreement.
